Dear Parish Family,
Happy Easter! He is Risen!

The theme for Easter is the joy of the Resurrection. Jesus' resurrection is at the center of Christianity because Christ is raised from the dead, Jesus is Lord, and as followers of Christ we share in everlasting life. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says "Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the "Feast of feasts, the Solemnity of Solemnities, just as the Eucharist is the Sacrament of sacraments." (#1169)

As Christian people we recognize that through the cross sin and evil still occur in our society, but as followers of the Risen Savior we know that love triumphs over hate, grace prevails over sin, and life overcomes death.

The Easter season, which runs for fifty days, extends from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. The news of Christ's resurrection is so big that we can't just celebrate it for one day only. LESSON FOR THIS WEEK

Brightly decorated eggs, Easter egg rolling and Easter egg hunts have become integral to the celebration of Easter today. The tradition of painting hard-boiled eggs during springtime pre-dates Christianity. In many cultures around the world, the egg is a symbol of new life, fertility and rebirth. For Christians, the Easter egg is symbolic of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Painting Easter eggs is an especially beloved tradition in the Orthodox and Eastern Catholic churches where the eggs are dyed red to represent the blood of Jesus Christ that was shed on the cross. The hard shell of the egg represents the sealed Tomb of Christ, and cracking the shell represents Jesus' resurrection from the dead. Moreover, historically Christians would abstain from eating eggs and meat during Lent, and Easter was the first chance to eat eggs after a long period of abstinence. Easter egg hunts and egg rolling are two popular egg-related traditions. An egg hunt involves hiding eggs outside for children to run around and find on Easter morning. Eggs are rolled as a symbolic re-enactment of the rolling away of the stone from Christ's tomb. In the United States, the Easter Egg Roll is an annual event that is held on the White House lawn each Monday after Easter.
