Thank you in advance for your generosity.

GUIDELINES FOR OLQP CHURCH - PHASE ONE

Our Church will be **open daily from 1 pm – 5 pm**. With the policies mandated by the state and local authorities, **only 10 people maximum** are allowed to be inside the Church at a given time.

- Our Church is open solely for personal prayer during limited and designated hours, that is, from 1pm to 5pm DAILY. Individuals and families enter the church for quiet prayer only. During opening hours, a parish staff member must be physically present in the church to ensure social distancing and sanitizing. No gatherings are permitted.
- In accord with national, state and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who have been exposed to an infected person are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days.
- Masks must be worn by all individuals while in the church.
- Those coming to church are strongly advised to bring with them hand sanitizer for their personal use. They are also greatly encouraged to use hand gloves and bring disinfecting wipes to sanitize before and after the specific area they use. This is to ensure and assure the safety and protection of each one.
- Public celebrations of liturgies, devotions, or other group prayer are not permitted at this time.
- Holy water fonts remain empty until further notice.
- Individuals and families must maintain social distancing (six feet) between each person while in the church. Please stay only at the designated and marked area for use. Our Elevator is off limit until further notice.
- Notification and signs regarding the requirement of masks and social distancing are to be posted prominently. Please follow them accordingly.
- Pews, door handles and knobs, restrooms and high traffic areas of the church should be wiped down and sanitized at regular intervals with the removal of trash and other items from the pews. Our Maintenance Crew would regularly do the cleaning of the Church in the morning.

STEWARDSHIP - *Living as a Steward:* *Redemption and Stewardship:* Everyone has natural responsibility for a portion of the world and an obligation in caring for it to acknowledge God's dominion. But there are also those who might be called stewards by grace. Baptism makes Christians stewards of this kind, able to act explicitly on God's behalf in cultivating and serving the portion of the world entrusted to their care. We find the perfect model of such stewardship in the Lord. "For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him, making peace by the blood of the cross" (Col 1:19-20); and finally it will be he who "hands over the kingdom to his God and Father". (1 Col 15:24).

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION RE-REGISTRATION

Because of the current health crisis and our need to curtail expenses, OLQP is providing ON-LINE RE-REGISTRATION for grades K-8 this year. **You have received an email from the religious education office with all the information.** You can also go to the parish website. Follow the link to Religious Education to download the form. If you have a child new to our program or if there is any new information to be added to the current database you must include it on the form. All tuition fees have remained the same (1 child - \$125; 2 children - \$175; and 3 or more children - \$200; sacrament fees for First Eucharist or Confirmation are an additional \$100). You MUST be a registered member of the parish for at least three months before you can obtain a Sponsor Certificate or schedule a Baptism or a Wedding.

**A Reflection by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R.
Archbishop of Newark**



As we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost this weekend, we acknowledge the urgent need for the many gifts that the Holy Spirit shares with us during this troubled time. Now, more than ever, we need Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord (cf. Is 11:2-3) to guide us as we continue to protect the vulnerable, slow the spread of COVID-19, and begin the gradual process of recovery in our Church and in society.

Wisdom is needed to make the right choices even when there are disagreements, strong emotions, anxious fears and widespread uncertainty among our leaders and the people we are called to serve. Come, Holy Spirit, help us to grow in wisdom and to be prudent in our decisions for the common good.

Understanding is especially necessary given the scarcity of information and the widespread uncertainty about the accuracy of experts' opinions. Come, Holy Spirit, help us to reflect on your Word and search out the most accurate and reliable information available to us.

Counsel provides encouragement and hope, especially when things seem most desperate and beyond our control. Come, Holy Spirit, enlighten our hearts. Teach us to follow your good counsel and that of Mary, Mother of the Church, and all the saints, as we seek the light of Christ in the darkness caused by this pandemic.

Fortitude allows us to stand firm even when we feel frightened and weak in the face of physical, emotional and economic threats. Come, Holy Spirit, fill our hearts with the fire of your love. Makes us bold and uncompromising in our witness to the joy of the Gospel.

Knowledge reveals the wonder of God’s creation and the healing power of God’s love. Come, Holy Spirit, open our minds to the beauty of our common home. Teach our scientists and research professionals to discover the hidden elements that can lead to the prevention and cure of this deadly virus.

Piety reminds us to stay close to God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) and to imitate Mary and all the saints in our love of God and Neighbor. Come, Holy Spirit, fill our hearts with divine love and fervor so that we can serve our sisters and brothers unselfishly.

Fear of the Lord fills us with reverent awe at the majesty of God and the depth of God’s love for us. Come, Holy Spirit, inspire in us true reverence for all that is holy—including the divine image in “the least of these” our brothers and sisters in Christ.

These and all the gifts we receive from the Holy Spirit help to sustain us and empower us as faithful missionary disciples. Now, more than ever, they are powerful resources in our efforts to overcome the coronavirus and recover—safely and responsibly—from the devastating effects of this disease and all the collateral damage it has caused.

Keeping in mind the challenges we are all facing, and the needs of those who are most vulnerable, let’s pray together these beautiful words from the Sequence for Pentecost:

Come, Holy Spirit, Creator blest,
And in our hearts take up Thy rest;
Come with Thy grace and heav’nly aid
To fill the hearts which Thou hast made.

To ev’ry sense Thy light impart
And shed Thy love in ev’ry heart.
To our weak flesh Thy strength supply:
Unfailing courage from on high.
