Dear Parish Family,

As has been my custom for the last 10 years I want to report to you how the money that has been donated to our Maintenance and Repairs fund has been used since last July:

- 70 bulbs replaced in light fixtures in church (\$265 for bulbs, labor was volunteer)
- Snow and Ice removal (\$25,155 SBJC paid half \$12,577.50; special collection \$1,066)
- Repairs in boiler room of school - old pipes needed replacing (\$3,450)
- New ice machine (\$2,700)
- Parking lines were repainted throughout campus (\$3,550)
- PC roof parapet work (\$3,455)
- PC oil tank (temporary tank \$4,948)
- New shower stall and other pipe repairs in Rectory (\$3,801)
- Walls in Rectory repaired after roof and A/C leaks were fixed (\$6,000)
- Fence behind auditorium repaired (\$3,000)
- New lights in auditorium \$4,500
- Asbestos abatement in school \$11,580 (1/2 to be reimbursed by school)
- Repair work on pipes and classrooms in school \$25,000 + (1/2 to be reimbursed by school)
- Heating repairs in school \$2,382
- Auditorium/church heating repairs \$1,125
- Parish Center heating repairs \$7,550
- New sinks in Parish Center \$1,400
- New tractor mower \$3,200
- Land lawnmower \$450
- Tree pruning and limb removal \$906
- Outside lights at parish center repaired \$375
- Masonry work \$3,000
- Pavers around St. Francis garden \$600
- Church A/C repair \$850
- Downed tree removal \$350
- Church door repaired \$270
- Driveway repaved \$10,500

The second phase of window replacement in the school will be done this summer. Our share of that cost is \$25,000. A large donation (\$16,000) was made by one parishioner to go toward that cost, which brought our liability to \$9,000. This phase will complete the replacement of all windows on the Maywood Avenue side of the building.

All of the above totals \$111,408.

As you can see the monthly Maintenance and Repairs donations by you our faithful stewards of Treasure have helped to keep our facility in good shape physically and financially.

Why should I register in the parish? - All members of the parish should be formally registered as members of the parish. However, you **MUST** be formally registered if you wish to arrange a Baptism, a Confirmation, or a Wedding in the parish Church. You **MUST** also be formally registered if you wish to register in the Parish School or the Religious Education (CCD) Program. You **MUST** be a registered member of the parish for at least three months before you can obtain a Sponsor Certificate or schedule a Baptism or a Wedding.
